



Plaintiff Onboarding: Next Steps Checklist

Please follow this checklist to ensure your participation in the federal lawsuit is secured. Our team will review your submission and contact you if any information is missing.

Read the Litigation FAQs

Ensure you understand the goals, risks, and nature of a multi-plaintiff federal lawsuit.

Sign the Fee Agreement

Review and digitally sign the McBean Law Limited Representation Agreement.

Complete the Online Plaintiff Eligibility Form

Confirm you are a national of one of the 39 affected countries and have a **pending** application for Adjustment of Status (I-485), Naturalization (N-400), Asylum (I-589), or another immigration benefit at USCIS.

Pay the Fee to Join Lawsuit

Submit the one-time **\$1,500** fee to join the action.

Complete Your Declaration Questions

Describe how the USCIS pause specifically impacts your life (e.g., inability to travel, job loss, family separation, or mental distress).

Upload Your USCIS Receipt Notice

Provide a clear copy of your Form I-797C (Notice of Action) showing your case is currently pending with USCIS.

Eligibility Review & Confirmation

Our team will review your Plaintiff Eligibility Form and supporting documents to confirm that you are eligible to join the lawsuit. We reserve the right to disqualify prospective plaintiffs in our sole discretion. If a prospective plaintiff is disqualified, any fees paid will be refunded.

Important Notice Regarding Representation

Please do not contact our office regarding the status or substance of your underlying immigration case. At this stage, we do not represent you in the underlying matter.

Representation may occur only if you schedule a consultation and meet with an attorney to determine whether we can assist with your individual case.
